

Annual Meeting Minutes Sunday, January 28, 2018

Opening: Father Mark brought the meeting to order with a prayer at 10:52. He gave thanks for Brenda Faulkner and her contribution to our church.

Last Meeting Minutes:

Jordan Swonger was absent from the meeting. Father Mark called for corrections and/or acceptance. Goldey Vansant moved to accept the minutes and David Sipes seconded without changes. The motion was passed.

Vestry Elections: Father Mark

- Father Mark thanked retiring Vestry members Bluette Blinoff, Connie Clark and Diana Newcomer.
- Nominations from the committee for 2018 2020: Colleen Minahan, Dottie Wilson and Jeffrey Pike
- There were no additional nominations from the floor and no objections.
- Father Mark thanked Charlie Mead as Senior Warden and Molly Cannon as Treasurer
- He also thanked Bob Rosekrans for his work as the Junior Warden. He is stepping back and Charlie Schwan will take over.

Financial Report: Molly Cannon

- Operating funds exceeded budget by \$46,780
- Draw from investment funds down to 2.5%
- Mortgage Progress In the past 2 years, mortgage balance was reduced by \$218,000. The current balance is \$835,279. We pay \$1000 additional to principle every month and \$50,000 at the end of the year. At this rate we will be debt free in 6 years (2024).
- 2018 Pledge progress The operating side requires a leap of faith. There is currently a \$100,000 gap between what's been pledged and what's needed to fund our operations. We are hopeful as pledges have increased.

2018 Budget - Molly Cannon

The 2018 Budget includes personnel raises, increased spending on upkeep and care of the rectory and a Diocesan apportionment increase that is closer to the request.

2017 Accomplishments - Charlie Mead

We are growing – Over 2 dozen families joined in 2017

We've taken actions – Developed a Mission, Tagline and Logo

Worship – EFM and new music, held innovative services

Family – Reinvigorated Sunday school, hired Nivek as Youth Minister, and certified staff in Safeguarding Children

Outreach – Led Backpack program, Tornado relief, Soup Ministry/Farmers Market, New Recovery Group, delivered turkeys, Adopt-a-Bear, Food Pantry, Our Haven Ministry

Care & Community – New Dinner Groups, Newcomers and Meet & Greet Receptions, Increased communications, added a counseling service

Financial Sustainability - Completed a Parish audit, inventoried equipment, began Investment Policies for Investment Funds and training for Legacy Giving

Facilities – Completed varied parish and rectory upgrades and repairs including replacement of 2 HVAC units

Backpacks for Kids

The Backpack Meals for Kids program is an initiative through which churches throughout Queen Anne's County (and the nation) provide weekend food for children who are most at risk of not having enough to eat when school is not in session. Childhood hunger is a heartbreaking problem in our community, and the number of children served by the Backpacks program continues to grow.

With the dedicated support of parish and community volunteers, Christ Church provided weekend meals for 85-90 children at Kent Island and Bayside Elementary Schools every week during the school year. Supported by your donations of time, food and cash, we delivered 3,000+ bags of food in 2018. In the summer of 2018, we handed out 150 bags of child-friendly food at the Haven Ministries monthly food pantries and at a summer program at Grasonville Elementary. In the fall of 2018, we started the new school year with 86 children in the program.

We must raise about \$7,000 each year to keep this vital ministry going. We rely on and are very grateful for a steady stream of parishioner donations of cash and food to help us meet this need. In addition to the funds we raise, the Backpacks program is partially funded by the Queen Anne's County Community Partnership for Children and Families.

Education for Ministry (EfM)

MISSION: EfM is a four-year program in group reflection and study to support formation for Christian ministry in our daily life.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS in 2018: Eleven people met weekly for two hours in seminar format to build relationships for working together in community. Members took turns in responsibility for preparing and leading worship and initiating discussion. The group practiced various ways of examining life through a theological lens (called theological reflection) using a method in four movements that led to new understandings with implications for action in practicing ministry in their daily lives. We used a Study Guide provided by our Episcopal seminary at the University of the South in Sewanee, TN, for weekly assignments to read, reflect on, and respond to. Participants in first-year used Old Testament along with a commentary to help them understand the texts in their ancient and modern contexts. Second-year students read the New Testament with commentary. Third-year read a text on the history of the Christian church. All participants, with the support of the community of eleven, worked on discerning what ministry God was calling them to in their daily lives.

GOALS for 2019:

Add a few new Year One (Old Testament) students to the existing group. Move each of the other students onto their next year of study.

- Because of our church support of the Grasonville Food Pantry, Connie Clark, a volunteer, was asked to promote
 and collect food from the Kent Island Yacht Club members last December. She collected and delivered over 100
 pounds of food to Grasonville. Bravo!!
- Another highlight of the year was the continued work of the volunteers to support this ministry. When a
 volunteer was sick or would be unavailable, they switched and helped each other insure the deliveries were
 made to Grasonville.

Haven Ministries

Haven Ministries is coalition of churches in Queen Anne County that provides services to those in need by providing cold weather shelter (October through April), a Resource Center for education and classes during the day, two food pantries (Stevensville and Centreville), Church fund (for financial assistance), Thrift Store and Furniture warehouse. Christ Church participates in all levels of this ministry. There are two Haven Ministries board members from Christ Church helping with the business part of the ministry. Many volunteers help at the food pantries and shelter throughout the year.

Donations of clothes, household goods, furniture and building materials are made to Hope Warehouse and Our Daily Thread. These goods are then either sold for financial support of the ministry or given to those in need. Hope Warehouse also has a work program for those struggling to enter the workforce.

The Church Fund is organized through participating churches in conjunction with the Haven Ministries Resource Center. The churches have set up guidelines and contribute regularly to the fund for clients who need immediate financial assistance for rent, power bills, etc. The Resource staff provides vetting and budget management for each client to prevent or reduce future need.

The shelter is housed in the Kent Island United Methodist Church (KIUMC) in dedicated space. The capacity is 10, but additional space can be found in emergency. Each client is screened and participates in a program to find housing and stability. Many of these clients are employed but cannot afford rents in our area. In past years, we have provided for seniors requiring medical care, cancer patients, families with children and many others. The shelter is drug free and alcohol free. We have an operations manager that meets with each client as well as provides street outreach throughout the year. She sets up programs that are specifically tailored for each client's needs.

Any member of Christ Church is invited and encouraged to volunteer their services with Haven Ministries. Providing fellowship for the shelter, donations to Our Daily Thread and Hope Warehouse, helping at the food pantry are all ways anyone can help. Haven Ministries uses financial donations to pay support staff, purchase goods and services for the mission and invest in upcoming housing options. Cash donations, gift cards (in \$10-\$20 increments) and regular credit card donations are helpful. Please ask if you need more information.

Music Ministry

Finally, in December, we welcomed back the Westminster Ringers for a community concert that was attended by nearly 170 people. A large thank you to all the many dedicated volunteers who participate in the Choir and Praise Band, all who have supported concerts with food and financial donations, and to Father Mark and the Vestry for their support of the music program.

In 2019, we look forward to continuing to grow our musical ensembles. New members are welcome at any time in the Parish Choir and Praise Band. Singing in choir or playing in the Praise Band will enrich your life spiritually and musically and is a powerful way to connect with others at the church. We also look forward to continuing to reach out the community through concerts and special musical events. Finally, we plan to expand the use of guest musicians at our services, including guest brass musicians on Easter.

- · Reaching an agreement with an outside party for clearing snow in the church parking lot if needed, and
- Contracting to replace failing overhead power sources in the church kitchen with properly wired and protected outlets.

Future projects include (but are not limited to):

- Completion of phone and internet work,
- Complete kitchen electrical work,
- · Begin and complete kitchen floor replacement,
- Contract to clean rectory vents,
- Re-stripe parking lot,
- A list of items (large and small) that need to be addressed at the rectory, and
- Begin posting a "punch list" of items too numerous to be listed here, in the hope that members of our church may be able assist in some way.

Soup Group Fund-Raising & Fellowship

MISSION: Prepare and serve/sell soups and salads at the weekly Thursday Kent Island Farmers' Market and foster fellowship and relationships in our community. Provide food contributions to local food bank and Havens Ministries to meet needs of the food-insecure in our community.

HISTORY/ACCOMPLISHMENTS: CCPKI started hosting the Kent Island Farmer's Market in late 2011, and we took advantage of that opportunity to join them. By mid-January 2012, we had set up our own CCPKI home-made soup table with a couple of soup pots, selling hot soup in 8 oz, 16 oz, and 32 oz containers. We were an instant success and have been expanding our capacity and offerings ever since. Each week our volunteers meet in the kitchen, starting on Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons/evenings as we prepare soups and salads for the Thursday Farmer's Market. We enjoy a great fellowship with each other as well as our market customers, vendors, and the wider community. Our staff of volunteer soup chefs has grown from two to over thirty folks of all ages and includes several who are not even parishioners here. We are so proud of the wonderful opportunity this has become! Our total donation of soup profits back to the church in 2012 totaled \$5,802.00. By the end of 2018, we have donated over \$50,000.00!

GOALS FOR 2019: We will continue to grow and innovate in the kitchen with our weekly menus and market offerings. There will be some constraints on us in the year ahead with the upcoming kitchen floor renovation, but we will be able to continue with a more limited menu plan while that is going on by using the Camp Wright kitchen.
