

**Members:** Please wear your name tag located on the magnetic board in the narthex.

**Receiving Communion:** All who seek God and a deeper life in Christ are invited to receive communion, including children. After receiving the wafer, it may be consumed, followed by a sip of wine from the chalice, or dipped in the chalice and then consumed. If you do not wish to receive the bread and wine, cross your arms over your chest. We will offer a blessing for you as we share in Holy Communion. You may stand or kneel at the altar rail. **For those who have difficulty with stairs, the altar area is completely accessible by the side aisles.**

**Children:** A professionally staffed nursery is available from 9:45 a.m. – 11:15 a.m. The “Pray-ground” area located in the front of church is a welcome place for children to come anytime during the service. We want them to know they are welcome here.

**Sunday School:** We invite you to bring your children, from toddlers through 5th graders, to the classroom wing in the back. We offer a fun and easy going class each Sunday morning from 9:45 until the Peace, when we bring the children back into church to join you for Communion. Questions? 



A Reading from the Book of Genesis


