MEMBERSHIP AT CHRIST CHURCH PARISH

I am often asked "What is an Episcopalian?" Usually, the question implies a contrast to other Christians communities, both Protestant & Catholic. Of course, there's a short answer and a much longer answer. We are a church of the Reformation; we also maintain many traditions of the Catholic Church.



Church Membership is determined by Baptism. Whether one is baptized here or on another church, you are a member when you worship here regularly as a baptized person. We believe baptism is a one-time event and under no circumstances will we ever "rebaptize" someone. If you or your family members were baptized here, we keep a permanent record of that. If you should ever move away, you can ask for a Letter of Transfer so your new congregation will know about your baptism. If you have come here from another congregation, it will help them (and us) for you to request a Letter of Transfer. If you or a family member has never been baptized, speak to Fr. Mark and we can start preparations!

All the baptized are expected to make a mature affirmation of their faith before the bishop. The Service of Confirmation offers the chance for adults and teens to affirm their place in the church. Those who have been confirmed in another tradition can choose to be Received into the Church by our bishop who "recognizes them as a member of Christ's one, holy, catholic and apostolic church". Any school age students Grade 8 or above, and any adult who wants to join the Episcopal Church, should speak to Fr. Mark as soon as possible so they can be prepared for Bishop Santosh's visit April 23.

This winter, I'd like to begin some "time with the rector" so you can ask your questions. Our history is fascinating. Our Prayer Book is a spiritual gem. Our standing as Anglicans gives the church a worldwide reach. We will begin with a "Walkabout Tour" on January 8th. Immediately following the 8 & 10 services, I'll take all interested to see our ancient Bible, the Pre-School, the Kitchen, and Backpack Pantry. The end of January, I'll offer classes to prepare those who would like to make their affiliation with the Episcopal Church official through Confirmation or Reception into

the church when the Bishop visits in April. I have a book which can serve as an introduction.

I look forward to your questions as we grow as members of the church.

Sunday, January 22, 2023 11:15 am


There will be only one service that day!
