#### YOUR LENT IN ACTION

In every season, Christ Church Parish is witness to God's love for our community. Lent is our time to shine as we share. Here's how you can show love for our neighbors near and far.



**Haven Ministries Food Drive** – The single most effective assistance in our county starts at Haven Ministries. The Food Pantry and Resource Center in Queenstown open weekdays, with extended hours on Tuesdays. The Mobile Food Pantry operates twice a week. Non-perishable food items, paper goods and diapers are particularly welcome. On Sunday, March 19<sup>th</sup> we will fill the mobile truck with food and essentials. Those who shop online can have items shipped to us at 830 Romancoke Road.

**Backpack Ministry** – We continue as the hub for weekend meals sent home with school age children. These meals are critical for the many food-insecure children and their families. Healthy single serving items: mac & cheese, tuna, fruit cups and 100% juice boxes make a difference every week.

**Children's Clothing** – We are beginning a pilot program to gather GENTLY USED or new clothing to be distributed through Grasonville Elementary School. At this time spring and summer clothing size 3T to Youth XL will be accepted for their Care Closet. Drop off boxes will be in the Church Narthex.

**Disaster Relief** – For more than a century, the Episcopal Church has offered aid for in crisis around the world. Episcopal Relief and Development is currently funding on-going efforts using direct contact with Anglicans and Episcopalians in Turkey, Syria, South Sudan, and in the Ukrainian refugee crisis. Victims of Natural Disasters in the US are aided by automatic disbursements to affected dioceses. #### A Word from Our Sr. Warden

When Fr. Mark asked me to take on the roll of Senior Warden, I knew that there were two other items that would also become personal priorities. One, that I would continue and expand my role as a Mentor for the Education for Ministry (EfM) program. This is an excellent four-year course, also provides a foundation to develop lay ministry leaders in our parish. Secondly, I wanted to increase and strengthen the corps of volunteers who are part of our worship services.

COVID certainly took its toll in many areas of our church, including drastically reducing the number of participants in the important and beautiful ministry of serving during worship. We hope to find one leader for each group, EM's, Lectors and Ushers, who would like to coordinate and train new volunteers. We would meet once per quarter to put together the schedule, and coordinate training.

Participation at the altar during worship is a wonderful experience in which we all can find a role. There is no experience required, just a desire to be part of this fulfilling ministry.

In furtherance of these partnerships, we are conducting a Children's Clothing Drive from **Sunday, March 19 through Sunday, April 2**. Specifically, we are looking for new or gently used children's clothing from newborn through size youth extralarge. We will have drop off boxes in the church entryway for your donations.

If you do not have any gently used children's clothing and wish to participate in this project, we invite you to purchase and donate new underwear for boys or girls ages 4 to 10.

Church volunteers will sort the clothing by size, type and gender and deliver to Grasonville Elementary and the Judy Center. Spring and summer clothing size 3T to youth extra-large will be donated to Grasonville for their Care Closet and clothing for sizes birth to 3T will be given to children at the Judy Center Early Learning Hub in Sudlersville.

#### **BROAD CREEK CEMETERY NEWS**



1. On Saturday, May 13 at 1:00, a Service of Remembrance will be held at the Cemetery to honor those buried there. This biannual outdoor service is held within the confines of the original church and is open to the public. Families with loved ones buried in the Cemetery are personally invited as the names of those buried there are read aloud as part of the service. Following the service, refreshments will be served.

2. It's time to spruce up the cemetery for Easter. Saturday April 1 and Saturday April 22, will be clean up days. We will start at 9:00 and work for 60-90 minutes. If you can spare some time, please come out and help us brighten up the cemetery for Easter. We are getting the mulch applied in March so there won't be any strenuous work to do in April.

3. As I'm sure you know by now, a 32 niche columbarium is on order; we expect delivery later this summer. The Cemetery Committee has set the price per niche at \$1,750 if the niche is purchased in 2023. The price will increase to \$2,500 in 2024. #### JAMIE JACOBS MEMORIAL BUTTERFLY GARDEN by Tim Aland



The winter has been extremely mild, and I took advantage of a warm Saturday to give the Jamie Jacobs Memorial Butterfly Garden (JJMBG) it's annual trimming. A former parishioner and landscape architect encouraged me to do this to prevent other species from overtaking the garden. In doing this you can tell that some of the plants have taken over and also there has been an incursion of, yes, wire grass (we love that stuff).

Jamie was a wonderful woman and mother who died way to young from cancer. She was a gardening lover like all of us and was very much into native pollinator gardens. When the JJMBG was first laid out, the youth group in which she participated did the work. Unfortunately, I have not been able to get the original plans and the maintenance has been overwhelming. Kathy Christopher has tried to weed her way in but since there have been volunteer plants from the nearby ponds, the garden has not been what it was intended to be.

I propose that as a group, we put focus on trying to clean this up and put mulch paths to assist access for maintenance. I feel that we should divide the garden into four sections so we can concentrate/attack the weeds more directly. This method will also give folks the opportunity to "adopt" a section. I will bring up my tiller so we can make defined edges for easier maintenance.

As stated earlier, this is a Maryland Native Species Pollinator/ Butterfly Garden and all plantings should fit that description. We will need to try and identify and label as much as we can and thin out plants that have taken over. Here is a link from the extension office that talks about how to's and whats of the garden https:// extension.umd.edu/resource/pollinator-gardens. Some of these plants are in our in our yards and can easily transplant.


Join the Choir for Holy Week & Easter!
