REAL PRESENCE

“You never know what’s gonna happen, until it does.” These nine words reside in my mind in the voice of Daddy Jimmy. My grandfather, James Greer Fullilove, was a man of few words. I remember his love of baseball, comments on the weather, and saying grace at the family table. Born in 1889 he saw much happen that no one ever expected. Rather than living in fear, he simply received the unexpected and moved forward. World Wars, Great Depression, Cold War: he met them all with quiet charm and a measured hope.

For many days, none of us have known what would happen from one Sunday to next. We have responded to shutdowns, quiet days, and a steady restart. Now, like the women at the tomb on that first Easter, we are in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. Today we see the Real Presence in the faces of those around us. Gary Van Essen, Brenda Faulkner, Bob Moore, and Lindy Coltharp have been steadfast in hope over these years. The addition of Jane Ford has brought new energy to family ministry that has strengthened us all. We also have new parish leadership: Lois Vanderbok, Goldey Vansant, Dennis Conrad, the Vestry are looking creatively at our program, finances, and facilities. Remember all these sisters and brothers in your prayers today.

This happy Easter, our future is hidden in Christ, but it is secure. Our joy is anchored in our real presence to each other and to our neighbors. We don’t know all that will happen in the years to come; but we know that God has us firmly in hand. Alleluia, Christ is Risen! The Lord is Risen, Indeed! Alleluia!

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Peter began to speak to Cornelius and the other Gentiles: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. On the first day of the week, at early dawn, the women who had come with Jesus from Galilee came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.



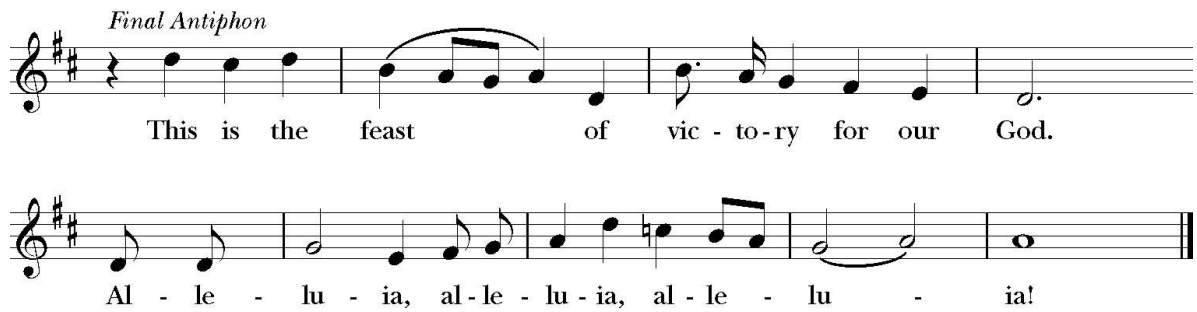


