#### **EPISCOPAL YOUTH EVENT 2023** Katie Schaefer

This summer, I had the incredible opportunity to go to the University of Maryland and attend the Episcopal Youth Event (EYE). EYE is a week-long gathering composed of youth who are sent from all 9 provinces of the Episcopal Church. Since the Diocese of Easton is part of the province that hosted this year's event, I got to go early to help set everything up.

For the first two days, only Province 3, which includes dioceses from Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and DC, was at the event. We got to go to the D.C. Zoo and the National Cathedral as well. The National Cathedral was absolutely beautiful with the bells, the garden, the small chapels and the intricate designs, and the views from the top floor. During these first days, I met a great group of people that I would stay with for the rest of the week.

On Tuesday, everyone else began to arrive. My group of friends and I made signs and stood by the entrance to welcome the incoming buses. There were people from all over the country and world: Guam, Puerto Rico, all of the US States, South America, Germany, France, and more. There was an event where all the kids got to meet each other and play icebreakers. Each Diocese also brought tradable items, such as pins, T-shirts, toys, and pencils to share with other groups. Tuesday also happened to be the 4th of July and we had the chance to watch the fireworks from the football stadium. We could see the Capitol's show, as well as Alexandria's. It was truly an amazing experience.

On Wednesday, we had our first worship service. I had never attended a service like the ones there. They were loud and exciting but I felt as though I still learned lessons from the sermons. That night, we went to the first evening service, which was a healing service. A healing service is where people have the opportunity to talk to a bishop/church leader and have them pray for you or another person. I had never been to one before, and it was a very unique experience. Everyone grew closer after we supported each other during this service.

We also met the band for the event. I had never heard music quite like the songs that they were playing, but I quickly learned the dances from my friends and we ended up getting all 1200 people joining in. One of my friends went up to the band members at the end of the night to thank them, and they offered to let him play piano for Thursday's evening service. The band members had never met in person before that day, but they all sounded incredible and were very kind.

On Thursday, we heard Bishop Curry's sermon, which was my favorite of the event. He was very passionate and it was entertaining to listen to him. We also began the workshops. There were ones about many topics, such as church, finance, climate change, and politics with the church. I attended one about baptism and how it is very important to start a relationship with God. I also attended one about finance and how to start making wise choices with money as a teenager.

That night, after the service, we had a dance party, which was very fun and uplifting. There were glow sticks, pom poms, and confetti. It was a very fun night and I met lots of new people. Every night, our "group," composed of the Diocese of Easton and the Diocese of Southwest Virginia, whom we were roommates with, would meet in the chaperones' dorm to discuss the day. I liked this because everyone got to say one thing they enjoyed, one thing they didn't like, and one thing that made them feel Jesus' presence. It was a great way to talk about everything we did while relaxing for the night.

Friday was our last full day and we made the most of it. After the morning service, we went to the "Terp Zone," which is a hangout area at UMD. It had a bowling alley, pool tables, video games, and a movie theater. After we explored the campus a bit more, we went back for a Province meetup. We discussed how we all wanted to have a Province event later in the year, and the leaders said that they would plan one. On Friday night, we had our last service and it did not disappoint. The band played multiple encores and even the bishops were dancing.

Saturday morning was very sad because we all had to leave to go home. Thankfully, our leaders promised that they would be planning an event for our province, and there will be one this spring. I feel as though the way I see my relationship with God changed after EYE. Meeting people and learning how they interpret different aspects of life, whether it be church, school, or work, was very eye-opening to me. I am so grateful to the Diocese of Easton for providing me the opportunity to attend this incredible event and for Father Mark and Jane for supporting me and telling me about it.

- A reminder that the Fall Ministry Fair will take place on October 7 at CCPKI, we will feature our Soup Group, a food truck will provide food for attendees.
- Next shared service with Living Water will be October 8 in Christ Church, Vicar Terrance will preach.
- The 40/10 Challenge reached \$32,567.00 as of September 14, 2023 many thanks to all of the generous donors and Father Mark and Mimi Delcuze.

- The Audit for all three entities of CCPKI, church, cemetery and school is underway with Molly Canon chairing a group of dedicated volunteers. Many thanks to Laurelle McReady for all of her time and talent preparing the documents needed for this undertaking.
- The Vestry approved a \$15,000.00 withdrawal from the Blunt Fund (endowment). This is the first time this year that funds have been withdrawn from any of the endowments.
- The Property Team has provided much needed data to evaluate our current insurance coverage for review.
- A detailed proposal was discussed to install LED lighting in the church. This will be forwarded to the Finance Committee for review.


